Dear Parents and Carers,

A huge welcome back to Term 2 of a very different academic year for us all! We hope you all had restful breaks and are keeping safe and well. We have now entered a second National Lockdown and the team at Parkland are all incredibly delighted that we can continue teaching the children in school despite this. Please can we remind you that it is absolutely vital that you adhere to the guidance for dropping off and

picking up in order to protect our children, staff and their families.

Lockdown and social distancing guidelines:

- ★ Arrive ONLY between your designated gate entry times. This gives everyone a 5 minute window to get through the gates safely before the next bubble entry. There should be no need for any waiting outside of the gates in the mornings at any time.
- ★ Ensure you walk your child up to their classroom (infants) or to the adult directing junior children. This ensures adults are not walking back into people behind them and applies to all year groups. This one way entry system is in place to keep everyone safe. Please ensure you are not dropping children at the gate and walking away.
- ★ Please do not block the twitten by waiting there. This route should be clear at all times. It is also important that adults are not congregating at the entrance gate and waiting. This causes others to have to walk around you to enter at the correct time and does not allow for appropriate social distancing.
- ★ Wait on the left hand side of the gate for your child at home time. Please do not congregate outside the gates or wait on the right hand side. Those leaving the site require space to do so safely and we do not want to risk any accidents. It also helps teachers if they can see parents.
- ★ Please do not wait in the road.

- ★ Be considerate to residents living around the school and to those working at Firwood House Residential Home.
- ★ Consult the school website if you need any guidance on symptoms or getting tested for Covid-19



★ If your child is isolating due to having COVID-19 symptoms or due to a household member having symptoms, work will be provided via your online Google Classroom (Years 1 - 6) or Tapestry (EYFS). This will mirror as much as possible work being done in school. This will ensure no gaps in learning. Please do email your child's class teacher if you need support with this. Teachers will provide feedback on home learning just as they did when schools were closed.

#### **FACEMASKS**

We strongly advise that all adults wear face coverings when dropping off and collecting children from the school site. This will help prevent any spread of COVID-19 to our school community. We are exceptionally grateful to NHS staff currently working on the front line and we would like to share this message from one of our parents currently working for the NHS:

"Coronavirus IS in Eastbourne. As a charge nurse in the hospital I KNOW the numbers are rising. Face coverings & social distancing have proven effective at reducing the spread of coronavirus. It's great that our kids are staying in school as I know many children, including our own, suffered during lockdown before. If everyone wore a face covering during drop off and pick-up it will help stop the spread, keeping our kids safe and keeping them in class."

A massive thank you in advance for wearing a face mask at drop off and pick up and supporting us in staying open and providing the highest quality of education.

#### WELCOME TO THE MAKATON SIGN OF THE WEEK



Each week, we will be bringing you a 'Makaton Sign of the Week'. Makaton uses signs and symbols to help people communicate. It supports the development of essential communication skills such as attention and listening, comprehension, memory, recall and organisation of language and expression. In school, we use a lot of

Makaton when we sing and when we talk to one another. In order to keep promoting and using Makaton, we will include a Makaton Sign of the Week for the children (and adults!) to learn and use. The lovely Mrs Deaves will model it for you.

This week's sign is 'good work'.

Good - Use your dominant hand (hand you write with) to form a thumbs up.

Work - Put your non-dominant hand flat in front of you slightly diagonal and use your dominant hand to make a sawing action on top.






## **EYFS LEARNING**

# **YEAR 1 LEARNING**



## **YEAR 2 LEARNING**

Year 2 have bounced back into Term 2 with their usual smiles and enthusiasm! We have been writing our own version of the story 'Sir Scallywag and the Deadly Dragon Poo' which the children have thoroughly enjoyed. In Geography, we have been learning all about the continents of the world and the names of the oceans. The children have used a variety of equipment to help their learning, including using a globe, an atlas, a map and Google Earth. Our budding mathematicians have been exploring patterns in number sequences, and have been developing their addition and subtraction skills. In art, we have been working on our own interpretation of Paul Klee's work. Well done to those children who participated in the STEM challenge over the holidays and built their own castles. We would like to say a big 'well done' to all of the children. They have worked incredibly hard this week!




















#### **YEAR 3 LEARNING**

Year 3 has had a fantastic start to Term 2 and have been learning about the Rainforest. We learnt about the different layers which are found in the Rainforest and wrote some interesting facts about each layer. In PE this week, we practised our throwing and catching skills using a chest pass and also had the challenge of travelling whilst trying to catch the ball! We are also very lucky to be learning the recorder and have further developed our skills and learnt some new songs! Everyday

we have been getting outside and have been running towards a mile by completing laps around the field. We have really enjoyed working on our resilience and perseverance!







**YEAR 4 LEARNING** 







Year 4 has been hard at work using the fantastic trim-trail. They have been developing their resilience and sense of balance with this brand new piece of playground equipment. Thank you so much again to our wonderful FOPs team for arranging such an exceptional opportunity for our children! They are LOVING it!

Year 4 also investigated how we hear sound. We found out that all sound is created by using vibrations and that sound travels in waves. We also found out that the ear works hard in order to hear and sends signals to the brain. This was investigated by listening to sounds around school and finding out which vibrations cause this.









We then recorded this information and identified how other sounds are made too, such as how elastic can make sounds by being pulled over a container. Well done, Year 4, for an excellent afternoon of Science!


#### **YEAR 5 LEARNING**

Year 5 has had a fabulous 6 weeks of learning about Earth and Space. This culminated in the Oreo eating challenge to show the phases of the moon. Ask your child about a waning and waxing crescent - they are now experts! Our next science work will be on forces. We have planned lots of exciting experiments.

## DAILY READING SESSIONS AT PARKLAND

The Parkland Federation is exceptionally proud of the teaching of reading in all year groups, from early phonics to detailed comprehension and analysis skills. Many of you, from historical visits to the school, will be familiar with such questions types as **Retrieval**, **Inference and Choice**. As they progress through the schools, your children learn to identify different comprehension questions and develop important strategies to answer them effectively. This focus has been very successful and will continue to be a major part of reading sessions.

Both schools are currently taking part in a very exciting fluency project, as this part of reading is also a crucial life skill. Children are given a daily fluency focus to develop the four important elements of:

- · Accuracy the ability to identify most words correctly
- Automaticity fast, effortless word recognition
- Rate the speed maintained while reading accurately
- Prosody reading with rhythm and intonation.

Your children may have talked about adding a code to a text, in order to help them become experts. We will keep you updated, as this exciting project develops, and are sure it will help our Parkland learners in their future careers!

#### WELLBEING FOCUS OF THE FORTNIGHT

Family life plays such an important role in the wellbeing of both children and parents. Parents spending good quality time with their children can be very effective in boosting wellbeing. Children's wellbeing centres on time with a happy, stable family, having good friends and plenty of things to do, especially outdoors. Developing a strong sense of wellbeing can help teenagers manage the challenges of the developmental years and be a protective factor against mental health issues. Wellbeing is important for the whole family to develop and is



something you can work on together. This is essential now more than ever. Our next recommendation is:

Be Physically Active: Although the gym has closed until next month, we are blessed to live in the beautiful town of Eastbourne. There are so many things you can do to stay active during lockdown and exercise outside is within the safe guidelines. Go for a walk over The Downs, walk along the seafront, make a circuit training loop in your back garden and challenge yourself to beat your best time (or other members of your household!). How many star jumps can you do in a minute, how many burpees (Ms Castle-Mercer's favourite) can you do in a minute, how many times can you run around your garden/the local park? Can you find a yoga tutorial online and master The Downward Dog? If you do exercise outside, don't forget to stay socially distanced at all times from others who are out and are not in your household. Physical activity keeps you physically fit, allows you to set yourself goals and raises your self-esteem. The chemical changes exercise causes in your brain also promotes emotional well being.
